



ALKOOMI

The Lange family's ALKOOMI vineyards and winery are located in the cool Frankland River region in the far south of Western Australia. Since climatic conditions are similar to those of the classic grape growing regions of France, it is not surprising that Frankland River produces some of the best wines made in Australia. The name ALKOOMI is taken from local aboriginal dialect and means 'a place we chose'. The logo represents the distinctive Australian grass tree which grows majestically in the area.

The cool climate and gravelly loam soils of the Frankland River region in the South of Western Australia are well suited to the production of intense and elegantly structured wines. This wine, made from estate grown fruit was picked between 12.8° and 13.4° Baumé to build complexity and give depth to the flavour profile and matured for 9 months with French Oak.

Growing Region: Frankland River, Western Australia.

Vintage: Bright and sunny autumn days and brisk, cool evenings were ideally suited to the development of intense flavour and colour in the fruit.

Colour: Deep crimson with ruby hues.

Bouquet: Cassis, blueberry and savoury cigar box aromas.

Palate: Medium bodied with juicy ripe red fruits, savoury spices and chewy sweet tannins.

Cellaring: Ready to enjoy now although will gain complexity over the next three to five years with careful cellaring.

Alcohol: 14.1 %
