



ALKOOMI

The Lange family's ALKOOMI vineyards and winery are located in the cool Frankland River region in the far south of Western Australia. Since climatic conditions are similar to those of the classic grape growing regions of France, it is not surprising that Frankland River produces some of the best wines made in Australia. The name ALKOOMI is taken from local aboriginal dialect and means 'a place we chose'. The logo represents the distinctive Australian grass tree which grows majestically in the area.

2011 Late Harvest

The estate grown fruit was harvested in the cool early morning of Autumn to retain the vibrant fruit flavour that this wine exhibits. The ferment was arrested whilst still retaining natural grape sugars and in balance with the fine, cool climate acidity of the fruit. The wine was bottled soon afterward to preserve the freshness of the fruit straight from the vine.

Growing Region:	Frankland River, Western Australia
Vintage:	An extremely dry winter was followed by a warm growing season with intermittent and timely rainfall resulting in vines producing low yields of intensely flavoured fruit.
Colour:	Pale gold with flecks of green.
Bouquet:	Lifted notes lemon zest, passionfruit and honey.
Palate:	Luscious and rich with flavours of ripe pears and passionfruit with bright fine acidity finishing clean and crisp.
Cellaring:	Ready to enjoy.
Alcohol:	10.0%
