



ALKOOMI

The Lange family's ALKOOMI vineyards and winery are located in the cool Frankland River region in the far south of Western Australia. Since climatic conditions are similar to those of the classic grape growing regions of France, it is not surprising that Frankland River produces some of the best wines made in Australia. The name ALKOOMI is taken from local aboriginal dialect and means 'a place we chose'. The logo represents the distinctive Australian grass tree which grows majestically in the area.

Sauvignon Blanc

The estate grown fruit was harvested in the early hours of the morning, preserving the delicate varietal flavours that define this cool climate, aromatic wine. A small parcel was held on skins before pressing to enhance the richness and flavour of the resulting wine. Another small parcel was fermented with some grape solids retained to develop structure and mouthfeel. The final blend exhibits the fresh, crisp and detailed varietal character that defines the benchmark Alkoomi Sauvignon Blanc style.

Vintage: An extremely dry winter was followed by a warm growing season with intermittent and timely rainfall resulting in vines producing low yields of intensely flavoured fruit.

Colour: Brilliant and pale gold with flecks of emerald.

Bouquet: Lifted grassy notes, complemented by guava and passionfruit.

Palate: Intense varietal flavours of gooseberry and passionfruit with a crisp refreshing acidity.

Cellaring: Ready to enjoy now.

Alcohol: 12.9%
